A compound sentence is a sentence that contains two independent clauses. These two clauses are usually connected by a coordinating conjunction.

Warm-up: Compound Sentences

Example:

Two independent clauses:

Batman is a hero.

He is successful catching criminals.

Combine into a single compound sentence:

Batman is a hero, for he is successful catching criminals.
